## Preliminary Programme

Sunday, 08 September	Arrival Travel from King Shaka Airport and/or Salt Rock Hotel to St Lucia Check into St Lucia accommodation: Urban Glamping/Hippo Lodge Informal Introductions and dinner
Day 1 Monday, 09 September	iSimangaliso Experience Tour  Driving through iSimangaliso Eastern Shores / engagement at Mission Rocks & Cape Vidal.  Engaging with iSimangaliso Park Authority and Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife learning about biodiversity, challenges, people, and parks.  Lessons from WILDOCEANS programme community work and small-scale fisheries project.  Welcoming braai (Barbeque): Address by a representative from iSimangaliso.
Day 2 Tuesday, 10 September	Capacity Building Part 1 Facilitated session on leadership as young people in the environmental sector. Facilitated session on communications. Special focus on building relationships, mastering difficult conversations and conflict management.
Day 3 Wednesday, 11 September	Capacity Building Part 2 & Collaboration  Estuary Walk: Highlights challenges and governance issues from recent years.  Hippo's Den: Working in groups and drawing from diverse experience; youth will design solutions to challenges presented in previous sessions and pitch them to a panel and be questioned and tested on their theory.
Day 4 Thursday, 12 September	Intergenerational exchange: Senior project leaders sharing lessons with youth.  A Common Vision on Lake Management (facilitated by GNF)  Boat Cruise at the estuary viewing crocodiles and hippos.  Inspirational Journeys: Young people sharing their personal journeys in South Africa and engaging with participants to exchange knowledge. Topics: funding conservation projects, social entrepreneurship, and governance.
Day 5 Friday, 13 September	Closing Café Conversation: Key lessons and take aways from the SLJ Alumni-Network, way forward and closure. Departure: for those preferring to leave in the afternoon Amathalente Cultural Tour: Visit to a village to learn customs of traditional Zulu people. The tour includes traditional outfits, beadwork and Zulu dancing (for those traveling on Saturday).
